



## When will Westminster Church Reopen?

Dear members and friends of Westminster,

That's a question I get asked pretty regularly these days!

I first want to thank you for your patience and flexibility in adjusting to online weekly worship and virtual church meetings. And I want to thank our great staff for their flexibility and resilience in this stressful time: Katie Bencze, Amy Poland, and Joe Chrisman. John Tarr has also spent many volunteer hours working with me as we began to offer worship via YouTube in late March.

Our Session met May 26th to consider recent developments in Dane County and the best advice from public health officials for religious communities. The safety of our congregation remains our primary concern as we consider our next steps. With that in mind, I am pleased to report that our Session came to a quick consensus about the process for reopening our church:

**We will consider in-person worship when Dane County moves to Phase 2 of its reopening plan.** As a County we just moved to Phase I, and you may have noticed that businesses are beginning to reopen with strict controls on maximum room capacity (25% in Phase 1), social distancing guidelines, mask wearing, and new sanitation protocols. Our Session and staff will continue to monitor the local situation closely, and rely on public health officials for guidance.

**When we do reopen, there will be a "new normal" in Sunday morning in-person worship.** To maximize personal safety, all of us must wear face masks. Seating will be six feet apart from one another. There will be no choir and no congregational singing (considered to be potential "super-spreaders" of the virus). There will be new processes for the distribution of bulletins, receiving the offering, passing the peace, and taking communion. The Session will be developing all the necessary guidelines and instructions to help educate the congregation, greeters, ushers, and communion servers about the "new normal" as we all seek to provide a worship environment that is safe for all participants.

**Survey the congregation.** In June, we plan to survey the entire congregation to see who plans to return to in-person worship under the "new normal" mentioned above. Some of our older members with chronic health conditions may choose not to return to worship until a vaccine is readily available to the public and restrictions are eased. We'd like to know what your plans are so that we as a congregation can best meet your needs.

**Church and outside groups can meet at the church beginning mid-June, but with important caveats.** By mid-June the Session will have adopted COVID-19 building use policies that will limit the size of groups that can meet in each of our meeting spaces, and require mask-wearing and social distancing for all meeting participants. The video conferencing service Zoom will continue to be available to all church groups.

**Online worship will become a permanent feature of our worship life, even when we return to in-person worship.** The online worship option will continue to be available for anyone who cannot attend in-person worship as well as friends and visitors to our website.

You should know that the Sessions of Covenant and Christ Presbyterian Churches have made decisions very similar to ours. Please feel free to reach out to me or any Session member if you have any questions or need more information. I am grateful that even though our building is closed, our church is at work, seeking to be faithful to Christ's mission and ministry in this community.

### Westminster joins others to become a Matthew 25 Congregation

The Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), gathering at the 2016 & 2018 General Assemblies, committed to offering churches the opportunity to embrace Jesus's scriptural call found in Matthew 25: 31-46. According to the PCUSA informational materials, "As a Matthew 25 church, we are called to live out true discipleship by acting boldly, compassionately and fearlessly serving people who are hungry, oppressed, imprisoned or poor." The hope is that 20% of churches in a presbytery or synod would commit to this vision to make actual progress on these goals. This tipping point of 20% is the "social science benchmark for success" in any project.

On April 28, the Westminster's session voted to become a Matthew 25 congregation. The only commitment we made to join this movement was our willingness to share our journey with others. As many of you are already aware, we have been advancing on this path of service for many years. The mission committee will review the materials provided by the PCUSA, seeking improvements in our present programs and exploring new ways our congregation might work in helping those in need. Opportunities abound for interested congregation members to join this initiative that is as yet uncharted to see how your faith journey might be strengthened along the way.
