

### Sunday Morning Bible Study With Pastor Scott Resumes April 18

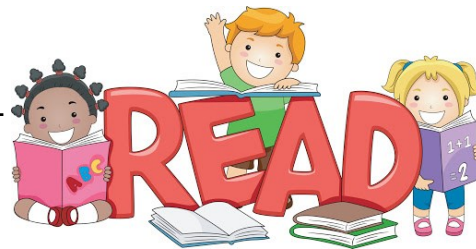

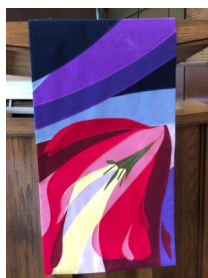
### In Need of Audio/Visual Volunteers for Sunday Mornings (It's easier than you think!)

### The Symbolism of the Paraments

The liturgical season of Lent began on Ash Wednesday and continues through Holy Week. The liturgical color for this season is purple. Canadian liturgical artist Karen Brodie, who created the paraments on the lectern and pulpit, describes her work as follows:



"Lo, How a Rose" is a design that sprang from an idea I had to use this symbol of love, the rose, opening upward from a landscape which is like an early morning sky, a time of waiting for the light, but is hopeful and filled with beauty and a coming light. We must wait and prepare and wonder during Advent like an expectant mother. The other side of the love incarnate that comes to us is Jesus' ultimate death. Advent would not have the same meaning without this death, on a cross, for us. Lent is the season of preparing and reflecting and inward examination as we journey toward the cross and ultimately, the resurrection. The idea in "Lo How a Rose" was to use this rose upward in Advent, yet downward, grieving, and inward during Lent. The petals that were seen in Advent to be part of the flower opening, will appear like they were dripping off like blood during Lent. The design will be turned upside down or right side up, depending on your perspective.

### Session Highlights:

Session held its stated meeting on Tuesday March 23rd via Zoom.

Stewardship presented a proposal for insurance coverage from Church Mutual Insurance Company to provide property and liability insurance and a Workman's Compensation Policy. The proposal was approved with thanks to John Braden, Ed Cothroll, Bob Forsberg, Bud Smith & Bill Tanke who investigated four companies and brought our coverage up to date at a reasonable cost.



Nii Abrahams, Associate Director of Campus Ministry at Pres House joined the meeting and introduced himself to the Elders. He explained his interest in making Westminster his church home and the Elders unanimously welcomed Nii Abrahams to membership. He will be received by reaffirmation of faith at the worship service on March 28th.

The congregational survey on Covid 19 was reviewed. There were 74 responses prior to the meeting with the majority of people having been vaccinated and expressing a desire to return for in-person worship services with appropriate health restrictions. After extensive discussion Session approved exploring the possibility of returning to the sanctuary for Pentecost Sunday, May 23rd. Committees will work with staff to develop protocols that meet Dane County Public Health requirements. We will discuss the protocols for worship services and community gathering at the April meeting before making a decision on re-opening. Worship services will continue to be available through the website when we do return in person.
