A Note from the Worship Committee

The debate rages on, or so it would seem, as to how the church should evolve, or if it should, to gather in the flocks of the non-church going Christians of the world. Here at Westminster the Worship Committee too is vexed by the ongoing questions of what we can do to engage new potential members and if there is a need to reconsider how we worship. We have been tasked with talking with our fellow congregants about the meaning of Presbyterian worship and if the shifting culture context is leading us to consider changes. Now, you likely won't hear buzz words like "contemporary" and "traditional" in part because these not only unfairly frame the conversation but also because they really fail to capture the point. Contemporary simply defined means occurring simultaneously or in the present while traditional means existing in or as part of a tradition or long established habit. Thus a contemporary worship can be traditional just as much as traditional worship is contemporary. The real question before us then is whether our worship service and style is inviting to visitors and new members or if we have become so engrained in tradition, or habit, that we have created a ritual that makes it more difficult for someone to engage. We ask only for your honest and prayerful responses as we try to discern the path ahead.

Speaking of tradition, we have arrived at summer which means the annual rite of passage as we...wait, we won't be changing our worship time? That's right Westminster friends, no need to set your alarms earlier because **worship time will remain at 9:45**. Due to popular demand we will continue with our current worship time through the summer. See how easy that was to create a new tradition contemporaneously? See you on Sunday!

Honduras ENT Mission Trip

On March 10, a group of ENT Surgeons, Registered Nurses, Audiologists, and other volunteers, 16 total, boarded an airplane in Madison, WI and flew to Honduras for an ENT medical mission trip. On this trip we perform surgery and see patients in a clinic. For many of us this wasn't the first trip. It was my 7th year on the trip.

We were especially excited to go this year as many medical mission groups cancelled their trips between November 2017 and February 2018. There were massive protests following the election for a new President of Honduras. Many Honduran citizens were killed and injured during these protests. Fortunately for our group the inauguration of the new President was at the end of January and the political unrest was (mostly) over.

Health care for the poor in Honduras is extremely limited and most of them depend on the many medical mission groups to help them receive the care that they need. The poor make up the majority of the population. Most of these people also lack access to decent housing and basic plumbing.

The first day that we were there we saw 85 patients that needed surgery. We had to take care of those that needed surgery the most. Unfortunately we only had enough time and staff to operate on 37 of them. We usually operated on patients between 10 and 12 hours a day, occasionally more.

We also saw almost 400 patients in the clinic over the time that we were Honduras. Many of our patients happened to be children from a local orphanage. We also work with a company that provides free hearing aides to patients after our audiologists do their hearing screenings. If the screenings result in the need for hearing aides, another volunteer makes a mold of the ear for the hearing aide to be manufactured.

The patients and their families that we help each year are so grateful. I am so thankful that God has given me the ability to help them.
