

Occasionally we will skip a Sunday for an adult forum on a timely topic which will also meet via Zoom. The Pastor's Bible Study class will continue to the end of November.

Property reported that the sanctuary roof will be replaced with work starting in August. They will also be meeting with a consultant on the type of video equipment we need and how best to permanently install it so that we can continue providing online worship services in the future.

Mission reported \$1000 was distributed to the Madison Area Jail Ministry plus the paperback books donated by the congregation. They also distributed over \$5000 to the West High Area Collaborative (Fellowship Hall) to feed families in need.
