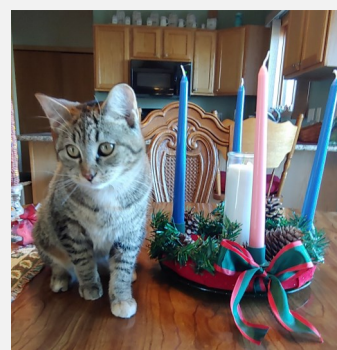

## Westminster Church Book Drive

As you know, Westminster has been participating in the Angel Tree program at Allied Drive for many years. This program will NOT take place this year because of COVID. But we will still offer an alternative opportunity to help this year. As you know, Westminster has long supported the literacy program operated by Kelly McCann at Thoreau School. This program provides books to students at the school that need some extra help to read at grade level. Because of virtual school this year, the Mission Committee is committed to provide books on a monthly basis to these children since they are not able to go to their classrooms and school libraries.



During December, Westminster will be sponsoring a book drive to get the books we need! We will be working with Mystery To Me, a local bookstore right here in our own neighborhood. There are a few ways you can contribute to this effort including:

- Dropping off or mailing a check at the church with BOOKS in the memo line and the Mission Committee can use those funds to buy books at Mystery to Me.
- If you have good children's books that are in like-new condition, you could also donate those. We are looking for board books to give to siblings and picture books for 1-3 graders. If you are cleaning book shelves and have things to donate, there will be a box at church for you to donate them.

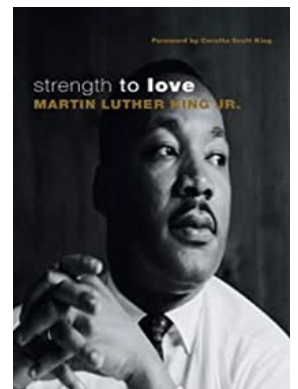
## COMING IN JANUARY

### Pastor Scott's Congregational Book Read in January:

*Strength to Love* - Sermons by Martin Luther King, Jr.

"If there is one book Martin Luther King, Jr. has written that people consistently tell me has changed their lives, it is *Strength to Love*."

So wrote Coretta Scott King. She continued: "I believe it is because this book best explains the central element of Martin Luther King, Jr.'s philosophy of nonviolence: His belief in a divine, loving presence that binds all life. That insight, luminously conveyed in this classic text, hints at the personal transformation at the root of social justice: "By reaching into and beyond ourselves and tapping the transcendent moral ethic of love, we shall overcome these evils."



In these short meditative and sermonic pieces, some of them composed in jails and all of them crafted during the tumultuous years of the Civil Rights struggle, Dr. King articulated and espoused in a deeply personal compelling way his commitment to justice and to the intellectual, moral, and spiritual conversion that makes his work as much a blueprint today for Christian discipleship as it was then.

I invite you to join me for a 5-week conversation about Martin Luther King Jr's. most consequential writings. We will gather on Zoom on Sundays at 11:45am beginning January 10 and continuing through February 14 (with a break Jan. 31 and Feb. 7). This book read is in lieu of the pastor's Bible Study class for upcoming season of Epiphany. Books are \$18 and will be available in the church office the week of January 4th.

**Session Highlights**

Pastor's Report - Scott reported that officer training for the newly elected Deacons and Elders will be via Zoom in December. Officers will be installed during a January worship service.

Mission Committee - Minutes from the October 4th meeting reported on the distribution of funds. The committee distributed \$4,000 in Global mission allocations and \$10,500 to Local Mission programs. The Thoreau Summer Reading program has \$1,470 additional funds for the program for 2021. Thanks were expressed for the committee's good work.

Stewardship Committee met on October 21st. One week after the stewardship letter went out approximately 25% of pledges have been turned in including two new pledge units.

Endowment Committee - The investments have done well and \$15,134.08 is available to transfer to the church for 2021.

New Business - Covid 19 update - Session discussed possible options for in-person participation in worship. Given the current rise in cases in Wisconsin the consensus was that we should continue with the virtual worship services as we have been doing at least through the end of the year. We will have some drive-by fellowship opportunities in November and December.
